

Creating a Personalized Philatelic News Source

Google.com Offers Customized Newsgathering

Recently I stumbled upon a feature of Google.com that has opened a new window onto the world of philately. Google's News section allows users the option to customize the categories of news that appear.

This led me to experiment with choosing a few keywords for these automatic searches of the world's news. The image to the right shows the previews of news on "Philately" on February 2, 2013. This simple cus-

tomization has revealed to me stories I would never have found if I depended only on my usual routines for checking the news.

For example, the second story, "Charlotte thinks philately will get her everywhere," tells about a fifteen-year-old girl from Plymouth, England, who decided to spend time with her granddad, going with him to the monthly meetings of the Plymouth Philatelic Society. The article states, "She is the youngest member with some others being more than 60 years her senior. But she says the age difference doesn't bother her. Charlotte added: 'It's not a problem at all. I get on with everyone really well, because they're all quite like my grandad; they're his friends."

Another story, "Gandhigiri calling," profiles a man, M.L. Rajesh, in Chennai, India, who collects memorabilia depicting Mahatma Gandhi. The story ties his passion to stamps: "While in Mumbai for a cricket match, ... Rajesh visited a philately exhibition where stamps on Gandhi issued by around 40 countries were on display. For Rajesh, collecting stamps from an early age, the discovery kindled an interest in stamps on Gandhi, which later developed into a desire to emulate the leader in the totality of his life and philosophy."

I'd recommend taking a few minutes, customizing Google's News page and then seeing what turns up to delight and surprise you.


LINPEX 2013

Stamp Show Celebrates 150th Anniversary of the "Emancipation Proclamation"

History buffs and stamp collectors alike will find their curiosity satisfied by the celebration of the sesquicentennial of President Abraham Lincoln's wartime declaration at LIN-PEX, a local stamp show set for Friday and Saturday, February 23 and 24.

Held at Quality Inn & Suites, 1511 Center Park Road, about one half mile south of 14th Street and Highway 2, the show offers free parking and free admission. Hours are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday.

The Lincoln Stamp Club, the show's sponsor, will release a special collectible envelope featuring a design promoting the U.S. Postal Service's new Emancipation Proclamation stamp. The cancel uses broken chains to illustrate how the



declaration began the work to end slavery.

The envelope's cachet—a decorative design—highlights a key phrase from the document: "... all persons held as slaves ... shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free" The cachet also includes President Lincoln's profile, based upon the sculpture by Daniel Chester French that stands to the west of the Nebraska State Capitol.

An insert will in-

clude a longer excerpt from the "Emancipation Proclamation." Each special cover costs two dollars.

Show highlights include a bourse with six stamp dealers, free reviews of collections to help individuals gauge their worth, and a beginners' table with stamps from the United States and around the world for a penny for youth and a nickel for adults.

The Lincoln Post Office will operate a substation on Saturday, selling stamps, special philatelic items for stamp collectors, and providing the special show cancel. The club's members will exhibit highlights from their collections:

- the Rev. L.L. Langstroth, father of American beekeeping (Ken Pruess);
- first-day covers from Germany (Ricky George);
- the life and legacy of St. Benedict; the Fort Sumter Centennial issue of 1961 (David Frye);
- the Civil War correspondence of Howell Cobb (Herb Henry);
- first-day, homemade, and other covers (Joel Johnson);
- the Purple Heart

- Medal (Carl Marks);
- the Three-Cent Prexie (Mike Ley); and
- a survey of Vatican City stamps (Kurt Meyer).

Show covers can be ordered by mail. Orders should include a self-addressed #10 business envelope and cash, check, or money order made out the Lincoln Stamp Club, sent to the Lincoln Stamp Club, 3240 Sheridan Court, Lincoln, NE 68506.

The Emancipation Proclamation

... Now, therefore I, Abraham Lincoln, ... do order and declare that all persons held as slaves within said designated States, and parts of States, are, and henceforward shall be free And upon this act, sincerely believed to be an act of justice, warranted by the Constitution, upon military necessity, I invoke the considerate judgment of mankind, and the gracious favor of Almighty God.

—January 1, 1863
