Finding Books, Journals, Auction Catalogues, Ancillary Reference Materials Assembling a Personal Reference Library Aids Philatelic Pursuits

A mission trip to Tanzania a year ago naturally turned my stamp-collecting gaze to the postal issues of this country in East Africa. I quickly learned that its postal history was much richer—and more complex—than I had first envisioned.

To help me learn more about these details, I began assembling a reference library. The picture to the right shows the bound items I've

accumulated so far. Taking a walk through the items on this shelf will illustrate the kinds of materials one can assemble, regardless of one's collecting focus, as philatelic study aids.

Catalogues: Scott Catalogue and Stanley Gibbons Catalogue: East Africa with Egypt and Sudan. The latter collects all of the issues in my collection in one slim volume, rather than spreading them across four hefty ones. A big advantage.

Auction Catalogue: British East Africa and Uganda: The Award-Winning Collections of George T. Krieger. Such auction listings provide invaluable historical insights illuminating a country's many unique postal items.

Postal History Books: British East Africa: The Stamps, Postal Stationery & Cancellations; East Africa: The Story of East Africa and Its Stamps; and The Postal History of Tanganyika: 1915–1961. Books like these provide access to the rich fruits of researchers' labors.

General References: East Africa Community. An annotated list of official government documents and publications. I hope to use this to track down Tanzanian postal bulletins with postage rate schedules. Essential Swahili Dictionary. Many Tanzanian stamps include inscriptions in Swahili. Northern Tanzania and other guides. These help to fill in the background details of stamps' subjects.

Journals: German Postal Specialist, "The Allied Occupation of German East Africa, 1914–1920, March–April 2015. It helps to look in specialty niches that overlap with one's selected region. My search continues.

Organizations: The East Africa Study Circle, based in Great Britain, produces a journal, *B.E.A.* I hope to join this group.

I hope this gives you some ideas for expanding your library. What's on your shelves?

Stamp Club Members Garner Awards at Omaha Show

Three members of the Lincoln Stamp Club entered exhibits in the Omaha Stamp Show, Sept. 12–13, 2015, and won awards for their presentations.

Kenneth Pruess received a gold award for his exhibit, "New York Stock Transfer Tax." The exhibit also earned the United States Stamp Society's Statue of Freedom Medal.

Mike Ley earned a vermeil award for his work, "Uruguay—The Pegasus Airmail Stamps 1929–1945." This exhibit also received the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors' Award of Honor.

An exhibit by **Carl G. Marks**, "The Purple Heart Medal," received a silver

award and the Women Exhibitors' Sterling Achievement Award.

"Post-War Burma 1945 to 1949," the grand-award winning exhibit by **Mike Ley**, returning from the 2013 Omaha Stamp Show, appeared as a non-competitive exhibit.

The show will be held again in September 2016.

National Stamp Collecting Month

Gere Branch Hosts Display to Recognize Annual Collecting Push

Since 1981, stamp collectors, both avid and casual, have marked October as National Stamp Collecting Month. This annual recognition of the hobby traces its roots to a cooperative project launched by the United States Postal Service and the Council of Philatelic Organizations.

Over the years, the month's popularity has experienced rises and falls, yet the month still remains a time when more established collectors look for ways to encourage those who are seeking a worthy pastime to give stamp collecting a try.

To aid in that effort, the Lincoln Stamp Club decided to seek permission to create and present a display at one of Lincoln's libraries.

Cynthia Carlson, the Club's president, took the responsibility for setting up a display at Gere Branch of the Lincoln City Library, appearing from Oct. 4–31.

Using the shelves behind the checkout desk, the display, "October: National Stamp Collecting Month," focuses its message on the interests of children and youth—dinosaurs and youth sports.

The display includes a giant magnifying glass and tongs, albums, and other books that relate to stamp collecting. The Club's business cards will be available for people who desire more information.
