Program: "The Washington/Franklin Series" by Dave Hamilton

David Hamilton presented a great hands-on program on the Washington/ Franklin series. Starting with a huge pile of 2-cent reds, he had us separate stamps into 4 distinct groups. And then with the aid of some pictures and charts, he walked us through the maze of 2-cent reds checking for different basic stamp designs; different perfs; watermarks; sizes based on flat or rotary printing; and minor (but important) differences in plate engravings. Everyone walked away with an excellent handout on these troublesome stamps and a better (and less intimidating) ability to identify the many 90+ varieties of the 2-cent reds in the Washington/Franklin series. 
