Dale Niebuhr talked about Stamp Collecting Day coming up on October 27 and passed out a schedule of activities for the Day asking for volunteers to work on each. **Curtis Peacock** and **Dave Wallman** volunteered to be official counselors for the Boy Scouts as they work on getting a stamp collecting merit badge. **Dave Wallman** reported that a contract has been executed with Country Inn for the LINPEX 2019 room and contacted a new dealer who will be mailed a contract..

Brad Shay showed a wooden box mailed from Oregon to Lincoln with 52 cents postage; a bag mailed with two 8 cent Liberty stamps; and two stamp pins. **Cynthia Carlson** showed a Lewis & Clark stamp bear from the post office. **Keith Riese** passed around several old family postcards from unusual places. **Dave Wallman** showed some interesting items found in donated material including a 1967 FDC of the Nebraska stamp used commercially. He also passed around an article by **Mike Ley** on exhibiting and a magazine picture of **Mick Hadley** working on an exhibit frame. **Mark Sellhorn** passed around a 1941 Danish cover showing dual censors from Germany and USA with two Danish Christmas seals tied to the cover by red Nazi censor markings.

Following the meeting, we enjoyed looking through APS Sales Circuit books.

September 20:

Dale Niebuhr talked about the meeting with Scott English of the APS at the Omaha Stamp Show and progress toward the APS show in Omaha next August. He also talked about Stamp Collecting Day coming up on October 27 and the schedule of activities for the Day asking for volunteers to work on each. 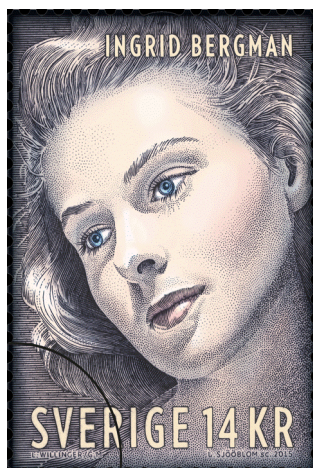
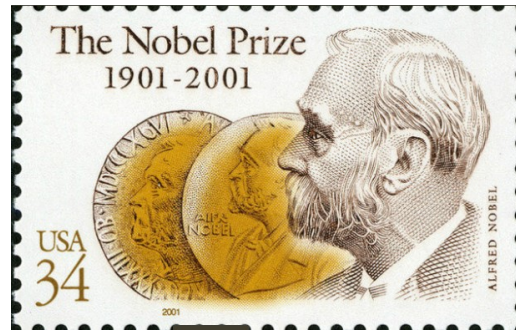
We discussed the need to be picking a theme for LINPEX 2019 so there will be adequate time for designing a cachet, a postmark, getting them approved by the USPS and getting them printed.

Mark Sellhorn showed a 1945 cover franked with 3 one-cent coil prexies (Sc. 829) - imperf between every other stamp and cut to show the imperfs

PROGRAM:

Bob Ferguson presented his program on the history of US Joint Issues. The US has issued stamps in conjunction with other countries 56 times (35 with European countries and 21 times with other worldwide countries). Those issues were often with a single foreign country, but sometimes were with up to seven others. These stamps were issued to honor another country, honor a share history, to promote a common interest, or to honor a shared person. Bob displayed beautiful digital examples of twin issues (same design) and parallel issues (honoring the same person or topic, but different design). The first issue was with Canada in 1959 featuring the St. Lawrence Seaway (a twin issue). In 1980, the US issued a stamp with Italy honoring Philip Mazzei (a parallel issue). Several of the US joint issues are shown on the next page.
