Civil War Sesquicentennial: 2011–2015

by the Post Office Department

May 2, 1961—The
“devotion to philately” of
a 15-year-old Charleston,
S.C., boy, who stayed up all
night in an unsuccessful ef-
fort to obtain the first sheet
of the new Fort Sumter
Commemorative stamps,
was rewarded today by
Postmaster J. Edward Day.

Charles B. Branan...spent
the night of April 11 at the
door of the Charleston post
office, hoping to purchase
the initial sheet of the new
stamp when it was placed
on sale for the first time the
following morning.

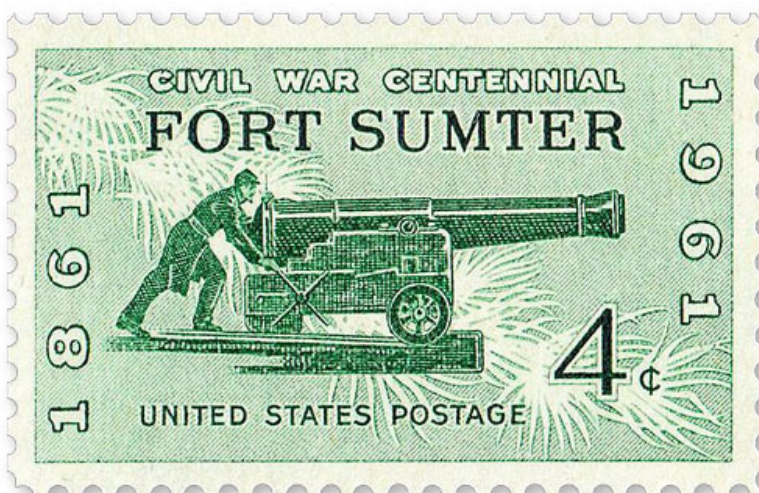
He wanted the sheet
autographed by the Post-
master General.

But fearing he would be late for school on April 12, Charles left his number-one place in the
post office waiting line at 7:30 a.m.—an hour before the stamp windows opened for business.



The Postal Service begins a series with these stamps commemo-
rating the 150th anniversary of the Civil War, joining others
across the country in paying tribute to the American experience
during the tumultuous years from 1861 to 1865. The stamps
will go on sale April 12. Art Director Phil Jordan of Falls Church,
Virginia, created the stamps using images of Civil War battles.
The Fort Sumter stamp is a reproduction of a Currier & Ives litho-
graph, circa 1861, titled, “Bombardment of Fort Sumter, Charles-
ton Harbor.”

On April 12, 1961, U.S. Postmaster General J. Edward Day re-
leased the first commemorative authorized and designed under
the Kennedy Administration. It also served as the first issue in the
Civil War Centennial Series, running from 1961 to 1965.

His disappointment was
capped when he learned
that, because of a flight can-
cellation caused by severe
weather conditions, the
Postmaster General would
not be in Charleston to ded-
icate the Fort Sumter stamp,
as was originally planned.

Reading...of Charles’ all-
night vigil, Postmaster Day,
himself a former stamp col-
lector, obtained a first-day
cover..., autographed it ‘to
Charles B. Branan, with best
wishes, J. Edward Day,’

and dispatched it...with this letter:

...“I am touched and honored at the great effort you made to obtain my autograph....

Such devotion to philately as you displayed in your lonely all-night vigil should not be unrewarded.

“Please accept the enclosed first-day cover of the Fort Sumter stamp, to which I have attached my signature, with my compliments and sincere best wishes.”

The enclosed first-day cover was postmarked: “Charleston, S.C., April 12, 1961, 9 a.m.—First Day of Issue.”
