CLUB HAPPENINGS LAST MONTH:

March 7: BUSINESS MEETING:

A treasurer's report for the first 3 month of this year as reviewed, basically showing a loss from LINPEX. We talked about future LIPEX shows and ways to stem the losses. We are exploring the ideas of setting up on Saturday, which would save money on room rent and security for Friday night and also moving the weekend to Feb 29/Mar 1. The dealers suggested more and quicker communications along with coffee and donuts being available.

The next meetings will be: March 21 a program on "Pitcairn Islands" by **Keith Riese**; Apr 4 will be viewing items from **John Schultz'** collection for sale to members; April 18 program will be an APS dvd on Fancy Cancels; May 2 will viewing items from **Mel Faas'** collection and other donated items for sale to members; and May 16 will be a stamp quiz on U.S. material.

Brad Shay passed around 1967 Nebraska Centennial covers – for LINPEX 1967 and for the 34th annual convention of the Trans-Mississippi philatelic group.

Dave Wallman showed various items from the donation boxes including buttons, expired coupons, and a packet of flower seeds.

Frosty Anderson passed around articles from two Nebraska History magazines showing a 1941 postcard from Valentine, Nebraska and a 1909 postcard after Lincoln voted to be dry city.

Geoff Duncombe showed 1873 and 1874 aerial pictures of the city of Lincoln.

Mark Sellhorn showed a 1918 censored cover to Paris by G. Amsinck & Co. and talked about their participation in espionage before the U.S. entered WWI.

We looked through items from Mel Faas' collections for sale to members.

March 21:

We talked about the APS show in August. We and the Omaha club will have three tables at the show. The APS will let us know what jobs we can sign up to help with and the hours needed. We talked about the need to register for the show early and sign up to volunteer at the same time.

Joel Johnson showed a couple of covers that are franked with the new star/ribbon stamps that were canceled on March 18, but the official issue date is March 22.

Dave Wallman passed around a flyer for the St. Louis stamp expo coming up at the end of the month and passed around an article form the April 1029 issue of <u>NEBRASKALAND</u> magazine about Nebraska airmail flights.

Keith Riese showed a stamped clear poly envelope approved by the USPS.

Mark Sellhorn showed a set of Lundy stamps overprinted for the June 2, 1953 coronation of Queen Elizabeth and a 1944 Wichita, KS cover franked with fourteen of the ½ cent Nathan Hale (Sc. 551) and a 1 cent postage due (Sc. J70).

PROGRAM: "*Pitcairn Islands*" by **Keith Riese**. Keith gave the history of the islands and basic information on the people, their livelihood, and their stamps. Made famous by the mutiny on HMS Bounty, the first stamp issue (10 stamps) was in 1940 showing, among other things, the island's location in the Pacific; the Bounty; a bible; and a school. Being a British protectorate, all stamps have a picture of a British monarch. Pitcairn Island continues to issue stamps and additional information if available through the Pitcairn Island study group.





