Pressing Matters

Stamps Printed in a Variety of Ways that Reflect Technology Changes

Last month the U.S. Postal Services stamporiented Web site—USPS Stamps—featured an interview with Joseph Bockert, who has worked for the USPS for three decades, focusing most recently on stamp development. The "Ask the Expert" feature posed a question to him: *How have printing methods evolved throughout stamp history?* He provides a really helpful answer that surveys U.S. stamp production beginning in 1847 and ending with contemporary issues.

His answer dwells a bit on the security of printing techniques and compares the strengths of those varying techniques. His whole answer is worth the time to read. You can find this piece on the Web.

Club Notes Passing of Herb Henry, Longtime Member

Herbert G. Henry, a longtime stamp collector and member of the Lincoln Stamp Club, died on July 11, 2015. About a half dozen members of the Club attended his funeral at St. Paul United Methodist Church, Lincoln, on Friday, July 17.

Herb was a sixty-nine year member of the congregation and had been instrumental in opening the door for the Club to hold its meetings at the church.

He focused his stamp collecting in several areas: the British Machins, the Confederate States of America, and modern mint United States stamps. He kept the Club's members updated on Scott's decisions regarding the assignment of catalogue numbers to modern U.S. issues.

He held several offices in the Club. He was elected vice president for 2010, but then assumed the duties of president upon the death of Alan Anderson.

LINPEX '13 included his exhibit, "Copers to Howell Cobb," featuring Civil War correspondence sent to Cobb, governor of Georgia, representative of Georgia, son of Georgia, chairman of session meeting in South, and general of the South.

A native of Hardy, Nebraska, he is survived by Ruth, his wife of sixty-eight years.

The Club is grateful for Herb's enthusiastic participation and will miss him.

The Stamps of German East Africa, Tanganyika, and Tanzania



Mwanza, Tanganyika, to Salisbury, Southern Rhodesia: An air mail cover sent on ? Aug. 1963 (the cancel is indistinct) from Mwanza on Lake Victoria's southern shore to Salisbury, the capital of Southern Rhodesia. The 20¢ stamp comes from Tanganyika's series released on Dec. 9, 1961, to mark the country's debut as an independent state. The 30¢ commemorative was issued jointly by Kenya, Uganda, and Tanganyika on June 28, 1963, under their shared East African Posts & Tele-communications Administration. Such joint issues were valid for postage in all three countries.

This is a subsite of the main U.S. Postal Service Web site. I found a great deal of helpful information about the various classes of mail, but not so much about individual issues. That's not its purpose. What it does excel at is giving the details about why certain markings appear and why the stamps on a cover reach the totals they do to meet certain rates and pay for certain services.
