"African American Postal Workers and the Fight for Jobs, Justice, and Equality" Book Review: *There's Always Work at the Post Office*


At the beginning of his book, author Philip F. Rubio explains how the title entered the lexicon of American culture through its refrain-like appearances in Spike Lee's 1987 film, *Hollywood Shuffle*, where several characters observe that the postal service offers African Americans a fallback jobs option.

From there, he explains the focus of his research, showing that "... a leading role was played by black postal workers in the United States labor movement and black freedom movement, and that they were influential in shaping today's post office and postal labor force in this country" (p. 7).

Rubio sets the historical context for the book's exploration by surveying the period between the Civil War and World War II. Then he focuses ten of the book's eleven chapters on briefer intervals from 1940 through 1971. The first chapters chronicle the fight against Jim Crow in the Post Office Department and its unionized workforce. Later chapters examine such topics as "Black Women in the 1960s Post Office and Postal Unions" and "The Great Postal Wildcat Strike of 1970." Ending the book's narrative in 1971 might

seem odd, at first glance, but Rubio makes the argument that the 1970 strike helped to set the stage for the creation of the modern U.S. Postal Service in 1971, making that a natural point at which to end this survey and analysis.

Rubio's research and documentation in this volume from 2010 are deep and thorough.

He has written a significant work on a key chapter in American history—and its postal history—making it worthy of one's time.

Edgar Hicks, a member of the Lincoln Stamp Club and the Omaha Philatelic Society, who is also a former member of the APS Board of Directors, headed the effort and made the successful presentation to the board.

According to a news article appearing on *Linn's Stamp News'* Web site, "Hicks' proposal connects the show with a railroad theme; in particular, the 150th anniversary of the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad in 1869." Members of the

Lincoln Stamp Club will have the ideal opportunity to benefit from APS membership in the coming years.



An Uncle's Coded Greeting: Ralph Sellhorn, the uncle of Mark Sellhorn, a member of the Lincoln Stamp Club, sent this Rebus V-mail to Mark's aunt and Ralph's younger sister, Mrs. Katherine Rohde. Mark writes, "Ralph joined the Seabees in 1941 at age thirty-five and served in the Pacific. I do not know what islands he served on. He and my dad would talk about the war, but never when we kids were around." Mark notes that his aunt gave him her V-Mail collection before her passing, as Mark was the only other war veteran in the family.
