Conversations and Covers Help to Build a Sense of Philatelic Community A Story about Collectors, a Mystery, and Breakfast

The Lincoln Stamp Club held its monthly program meeting on Thursday, December 15. We began by noting the recent death of the Club's president, Ken Pruess, sharing some short stories about his contributions to the Club's life, and talking about how to divvy up his many responsibilities.
Kurt Meyer made a presentation on the topic of the Protestant Reformation on stamps of the world. One of the Club's members, Dale Niebuhr, who had attended Club meetings as a boy and remembered Ken from those years, brought material from his collection to stock a sales table.
The cover depicted here caught my eye. I quickly made the purchase and added it to my accumulation. I was intrigued by the many auxiliary markings and the presence of the two postage-due stamps and wanted to do a little research to figure out how the services marked on the cover were paid by the 534 .
I usually turn to U.S. Domestic Postal Rates, 1872-2011, Third Edition for guidance. Maybe I was out of practice or a bit too tired, but I couldn't figure out how to match the services and rates with the total postage paid.

So, I took the cover and the book with me to Stauffer's Café \& Pie Shoppe on Friday, Dec. 23, to show it to a group of postal historians who gather there weekly. One of the usual crew-George Wagner-was not there, but regulars Dave Hamilton and Willie

Knopp were. As usual, we ordered breakfast and passed around and discussed our most recent philatelic acquisitions or notable items from our stashes of covers. They were a big help, offering this analysis of my new cover:

Willie pointed out the penciled notation of the word "Closed". He believed that the Post Office attempted a second delivery because the medical center was closed. That second delivery incurred another $13 \$$ special delivery fee, which was paid by the recipient and recorded with the postage due stamps.

## Kenneth P. Pruess: Postal Historian and Dedicated Leader

Dr. Kenneth P. Pruess, 84, the president of the Lincoln Stamp Club, died on Sunday, Dec. 11, 2016, after a brief illness. His contributions to the Lincoln Stamp Club over the last five decades defy efforts to compile into a list. Briefly, though, we give thanks for his work as president, vice president, frequent presenter of programs, LINPEX coordinator, registered agent, representative to the American Philatelic Society, auctioneer, exhibit judge, exhibitor, and the one who met with people who contacted the Club by e-mail to ask about the value of their stamp collections.


Retirement-A Time for Hobbies: Ken made a fifteen-minute presentation on Sept. 29, 2016, at the XXV International Congress of Entomology in Orlando, Florida. Here is the description of his topic. Introduction: Many entomological activities are possible after retirement. Fly-fishing and stamp collecting will be discussed. Other activities will be suggested. Methods: How one enjoys their hobby is only limited by personally chosen methods and objectives.
Results/Conclusion: Fly-tying and fly-fishing make use of entomological knowledge in an active pursuit of fish for sport and food. How do you imitate what fish eat? Morphological similarity is combined with biology and behavior of aquatic insects.
Stamp collecting can involve all areas of entomology: taxonomy, economic importance, medical entomology, and insect biology. My specialty is the honey bee. Many types of philatelic items can be used to tell the history of beekeeping. Glimpses into other entomological collectibles and hobbies are suggested.

In addition to his memberships in the Lincoln Stamp Club and the American Philatelic Society, Ken was a member of the American Revenue Association and the American Topical Association. He earned numerous awards for his philatelic research, including, in 2016, a gold award at the Sarasota National Stamp Exhibition for his exhibit, "New York Stock Transfer Tax".
