CLUB HAPPENINGS LAST MONTH:

July 6: Business Meeting:

We discussed submitting information or articles for the newsletter. Fall Stamp Day will be October 21 at the HBE office as last year. We will have displays of starter kits, member collections and tables to buy/sell stamps. We also discussed dealers and exhibits for the next LINPEX stamp show in February.

Several members brought show and tell items:

Nolan Sellhorn showed Disney and dinosaur stamps from his collections.

Keith Riese passed around the new Duck stamp for 2017-2018.

Cynthia Carlson brought in old copies of Mekeels Stamp Magazine from the 1920's and sheets of the new eclipse and sports balls stamps.

Joel Johnson brought old copies of Linn's from the 1930's that are donated to the Club by a couple in Hastings.

Goeff Duncombe presented his collection of Machin stamps and gave a brief history of the Queen Elizabeth definitives over the years.

July 20: PROGRAM: Member show and tell:

Nolan Sellhorn showed Japan and England stamps from his collections

Keith Riese showed his homemade Pitcairn Islands and Laos albums and a cover with the new eclipse stamp and a cover from Pitcairn Islands. He discussed how he makes his own albums for these collections.

Dave Hamilton brought in a new book *The Springfield Facsimiles of Confederate Postage Stamps* and presented his collection of Confederate facsimiles. Dave discussed the production of the facsimiles by different producers and answered a variety of questions on Confederate stamps and facsimiles.

John Radway showed family heirlooms of a Radway Ready Relief bottle, an almanac for the same and an RRR revenue stamp for use on the bottle. John will bring in other family-named items as he acquires them.

Joel Johnson brought in a cover that he inherited from his father and had questions on it being mailed and forwarded to four different countries. Several possibilities were suggested by club members with no resolution.

Dale Niebuhr showed an APS starter kit, Kenmore's World Wide album, and Mystic's Heritage U.S. album. Dale talked about designing your own pages or working with pre-printed pages.

Bob Ferguson handed out a sheet showing non-U.S. presidents who have been on three or more U.S. stamps. He challenged us all to find someone he missed.

Mark Sellhorn passed out a quiz on U.S. commemoratives.

Catapult Mail

Before the development of aircraft that could dependably carry mail non-stop across the Atlantic, the North German Lloyd Line developed a mixed mode mail service. Two ships, the Bremen and the Europa, were equipped with airplanes and catapult equipment and would begin to cross the Atlantic. When they came within the aircraft's range of the opposite shore, they would catapult the aircraft off the ship and the plane would fly the remaining distance with the mail. In this way, 1 or 2 days would be saved in the transmission time for trans-Atlantic airmail. Because of harsh winter weather on the North Atlantic, the service was limited to the months of May through October. These services were tested in late 1929 and operated regularly in the summers of 1930 through 1936. Of course, once longer-range aircraft were developed, catapult mail service became obsolete.
