CLUB HAPPENINGS LAST MONTH:

April 5: BUSINESS MEETING:

We talked about the Fall Stamp Day will be on October 27. The venue has not yet been determined since HBE may not be available and Messiah Lutheran will not allow non-religious meetings. We will look into having Stamp Day at Country Inn & Suites or at Unitarian Church. Dale asked for suggestions on other possible sites.

Dale talked about programs for the coming months. April will be on Martin Morck by **Bob Ferguson**; May will be **Kurt Meyer** presenting a program on how well we know the 93 counties in Nebraska; and **Dave Hamilton** has volunteered to have a program on the Washington/Franklin series in June.

After the meeting, we looked through 18 APS Sales Circuit booklets for purchases. There will be more booklets at the September meeting. In May we will again have a club auction and then have a mixture of auctions; member buy/sell/trade nights; and more APS Sales Circuit booklets in the future.

George Wagner passed around several large multi-franked covers and 1929 Post Office correspondence authorizing the 1 1/2c rate.

John Radway showed a 1930 first flight cover from Beloit Wisconsin posted by his grandfather; a 1928 Referee's Deed with five \$2 documentary revenue stamps attached; and two 1972 postal souvenir cards commemorating stamps issued in the 1940's.

Bob Ferguson showed two Forever stamps to be issued in 2018 and discussed the difference in descriptions of the printing process, stressing that engraving is not being done by a human being anymore.

Mark Sellhorn passed around a German postcard showing clocks with all 12's and posted at 12 o'clock on December 12, 1912.

April 19: Talked about upcoming programs through July and possible other club activities during the remainder of the year. **Edgar Hicks** will talk in July about the APS, Omaha Stamp Show and the national APS stamp show in 2019 in Omaha.

Joel Johnson passed around a cover with a large number of stamps.

John Radway showed some WWII patriot covers and a FDC Jefferson commemorative including a \$2 bill.

PROGRAM: Engraver Martin Morck—the next Slania? by Bob Ferguson

Fellow stamp collector Martin Morck combined his love of stamps and art when he applied for and was accepted by the Swedish Post to learn postage stamp engraving. He began his apprenticeship in 1975 and became a freelancer at the age of 20. During his four decade long career, Morck has created 830 stamps for more than 15 countries. Since 2012, he spends several months each year instructing 10 Chinese students in a one-year training program on engraving jointly organized by China Postage Printing Bureau and Post Denmark. He feels it will enhance the artistic expression of Chinese stamps and promote the future of hand-engraving. Several of his stamps are shown the next page.









