CLUB HAPPENINGS LAST MONTH:

May 3: BUSINESS MEETING:

Dale passed out a LINPEX Reference Guide compiled from the agendas, observations, and suggestions by club members to help with preparations for future LINPEX shows.

We talked about the Fall Stamp Day will be on October 27. It was decided to hold the workshop at Unitarian Church 63rd & A streets. The church offers a very reasonable rate; a large facility with all of the necessary tables and chairs; adequate parking; and a central location. We discussed the need to adequately advertise the workshop this year to increase attendance.

Dale talked about programs for the coming months. May will be a program by **Kurt Meyer** on the 93 counties of Nebraska. June will be a program by **Dave Hamilton** on the Washington/Franklin series. In July, **Edgar Hicks** will be here to talk about the Omaha Stamp Show in September and the national APS stamp show to be held in Omaha in October 2019. We will not have a program in October as we prepare for Fall Stamp Day. We are still looking for programs to fill out the rest of the year.

Dale reviewed the after-meeting club activities already scheduled. Tonight was again a club auction. In June we will have a member buy/sell/trade night. For July, **Dale** and **Mark** are working on putting together an evening of going through kiloware both US and foreign. It was decided to try the on-paper mix.

Mark Sellhorn was presented with the Lynn Casey award for his work with the club and philately

Geoff Duncombe brought in a book that he recently purchased entitled “A History of Britain in Thirty-Six Stamps”. It combines his interest in history and stamp collecting.

John Radway showed a 1998 cover jointly commemorating “The Slender West Lake and Leman Lake” by Switzerland and China.

Kurt Meyer showed an accumulation of stamps from Israel and a commemorative of George W. Bush with a 2016 stamp from State of Palestine.

Mark Sellhorn passed around an 11/12/23 German cover franked with 40 billion marks using stamps with perforated initials.

May 17: Talked about our Fall Stamp Day on October 27 and having a Scout Stamp Collecting Merit Badge booth with volunteers to walk the scouts through the requirements of the badge. Also discussed upcoming programs through July and possible other club activities during the remainder of the year.

Mark Sellhorn passed around a 1917 cover from the Recruiting Committee of the Southern Philatelic Association franked with a Schermack type III 2c Washington..

PROGRAM: *How well do you know Nebraska counties?*

And what does this have to do with stamps? by Kurt Meyer

Kurt talked about the naming of the 93 Nebraska counties and handed out a listing of how each county was named and when. Being the first state ratified following the Civil War, many of the county names reflected that recent history. Kurt walked us through different groups as counties were named for Presidents; prominent men (like Franklin and Hamilton); Civil War generals; and American Indian tribes. Stamps related to the county names were passed around to show the correlation. Kurt’s presentation prompted a lively conversation afterwards about the counties and the unique Nebraska’s unicameral. Some stamps are on the next page that reflect the name of some counties but are not necessarily the reason for the county name (just a stamp with the same county name).
