Dave Hamilton showed 3 Washington DC covers with free franking for postage and registration but required postage for the return receipt.

Mark Sellhorn passed around a 1930 first flight cover from Alaska to Washington state franked with a booklet pane of the 1c green Washington (Sc. 552) and a booklet pane of the 2c red Washington (Sc. 554).
