November 7: Business Meeting

We reviewed the success of Stamp Collecting Day with the number of visitors and the sales that covered most of the cost. LINPEX 2020 is just around the corner as we discussed choosing a theme and working on art work for the cachet and cancel. The show will be over leap day so if anyone has suggestions for a theme or cachet, let any other officers know so it can be voted on at the December business meeting. The current slate of officers was nominated for continued duty in 2020. **Curtis Peacock** and **Brad Shay** were nominated for Board-Members-At-Large. If anyone has other nominations, let one of the officers know so they can be voted on in December.

Amber Wesley passed around a postcard of the Malmo, NE postcard and an article on Stamp Collecting Month from the North Bend Eagle.

Brad Shay showed a group of FDC's for the issue of the 17c postage due stamps (Sc. J104); the 11c (Sc. J102) and the 13c (Sc. J103).

Mark Sellhorn passed around a 1916 postcard from a young man in Omaha to a young woman in Maine and franked with a 1c green Washington (Sc.424?) turned to the right saying "A Kiss" in the language of stamps.

November 21:

We discussed upcoming programs and initial preparations for LINPEX 2020. Suggestions on exhibit preparation were presented.

Cynthia Carlson showed a 1870 French folded letter sent from Paris and franked with a 20c blue, being sent by balloon mail.

Brad Shay passed around a couple of older magazine ads for the postal service.

LaVonne Uffelman showed a stamp for LINPEX 1977.

Willy Knopp passed around a "Sender's Statement and Certificate of Bulk Mailing" franked with one 3c (Sc. 807) and three 4c (Sc. 808) prexies paying the rate for 201-1000 pieces.

Dave Hamilton passed around examples from his collection and explained private perforated stamps with the Kansas City and Pittsburgh perforations.

Mark Sellhorn showed a 1913 humorous post card mailed from Lincoln to University Place and franked with the 1c Parcel Post stamp (Sc. Q1).

Program: "Private Perforations on Coil Stamps" by Mark Sellhorn

Mark presented the history of stamps being sold by vending machines and the companies that created coil stamps to be sold in those machines. Each of the companies created their own perforation system for coils used in their machines, some examples of which are shown on the next page.

Prospectus for Exhibitors

1. LINPEX 2020 is a noncompetitive show. All entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
2. An exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit, provided a separate entry form is submitted for each entry. Photocopies of the entry form are acceptable. The maximum number of frames per exhibit is four (4). Exhibits are limited to club members.
3. Each frame will hold sixteen (16) 8 1/2" X 11" pages without overlap. Each page must be inserted into a transparent sheet protector and progressively numbered on the back. Use of oversized pages is permitted.
4. The entry fee is \$5.00.
5. Entry forms and fee must be mailed to the exhibits coordinator (see entry form). Entry form must be received by Jan. 31 2020.

7. Personally delivered exhibits will be accepted at Country Inn & Suites, 5353 N. 27th Street, Lincoln NE after 4:00 p.m. on Friday, Feb 28, 2020 and between 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 1, 2020.
8. Any exhibitor who does not pick up his or her exhibit in person (or have his or her agent do so) must include prepayment for the return of the entry. Provide instructions for return on the entry form. Please note that the Lincoln Stamp Club will accept and return exhibits sent by the USPS or FedEx. No exhibits will be released until the exhibit floor is cleared of all visitors.
9. Owners must provide their own insurance. All reasonable care will be taken to assure the safety of exhibits. No responsibility, however, may be attached to the LINPEX committee, the Lincoln Stamp Club, or Country Inn & Suites, including officers, members, or employees, for a loss or damage.
