Mike Ley showed a 1967 Nebraska Statehood stamp with signatures of the picture and letter engravers and a copy of the publicity photo for the stamp.

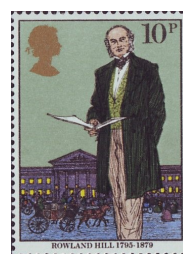
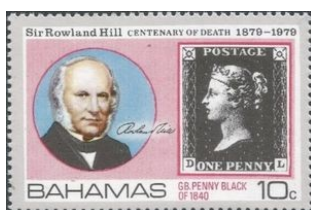
Mark Sellhorn showed a 1937 air mail special delivery cover sent between General Electric offices franked with 6c airmail stamp (Sc. C19) and 10c special delivery stamp (Sc. E15) both with perfin *GE*.

**Program: "The Beginners of Modern Philately - Sir Rowland Hill
and William Mulready" by Mark Sellhorn**

Mark took us through the history of Rowland Hill and William Mulready in creation of the first national postage stamps and lettersheets in 1840. The Penny Black, and Mulready's envelopes were only on sale for nine months, but they each led to other variations that have continued to this day. The Two Pence Blue issued in 1840 endured for 40 years and the Penny Black's successor, the Penny Red, was used until 1879. Great Britain replaced the highly unpopular and greatly ridiculed Mulready covers in 1844 with other lettersheets. Since then an untold number of these small adhesives have been produced by every country in the world and have created the philatelic hobby that we all enjoy today.
