**Program**: "The Iditarod and Stamp Collecting"

Marcia talked about the famous dogsled race from Anchorage to Nome, Alaska and her collection of FDC's and autographs. The 1,049-mile race began in 1973 to commemorate a 1920's effort to deliver diphtheria medicine to an isolated village in northern Alaska and to revitalize the interest in the use of dogsleds. The first race in 1973 was won by Dick Wilmarth and had no women contestants. But in 1974 three women raced and Mary Shields became the first woman to finish the race, although she did not win. Marcia also talked about the care and breeding of the dogs and the use of veterinarians along the way to ensure their care.

To enhance her enjoyment of the Iditarod, Marcia created hand-drawn cachets, franked the covers with the 2009 Alaska statehood stamps, and sent them in for first day cancellations. She then sent them off to a wide variety of "mushers" (although no one ever says "mush") for autographs. Several of these covers are shown on the next page. Also shown is a cover actually carried by May Shields in 1974 in the race to Nome. As a note of interest, Marcia told us that Dee Dee Jonrowe and her team are the ones pictured on the Alaska statehood stamp. As a collector of many things, Marcia has also added musher tracing cards to her collection.



Mail carried by Mary Shields in 1974 from Anchorage to Nome.










### **Business Letter Bears Marks of Two Supplemental Services**



by David M. Frye, dfrye@WideSky.biz **Orient to Des Moines:** A #10 security envelope bears \$2.77 in postage to pay the prevailing rates on 22 October 1997 for a single-weight first-class letter sent as certified mail with return receipt request-

Business letters often reflect senders' uses of supplemental postal services. The front of this letter, sent by an individual to an insurance company, indicates the use of two services—certified mail and return receipt noted with a label and auxiliary marking, respectively—beyond the basic first-class mailing. Four stamps provided a payment of \$2.77. The stamps include the 2¢ Mary Lyons and 15¢ Buffalo Bill Cody issues from the Great Americans Series, a 60¢ Eddie Rickenbacker international-rate stamp, and a \$2 Bobcat definitive issue from the Flora and Fauna Series.1 Part of interpreting the traces of a cover's postal use entails matching the services purchased with the postage paid:

First-class surface letter rate ≤ 1 oz.	\$0.32
Certified mail service	1.35
Return receipt service	1.10
TOTAL FOR ALL SERVICES	\$2.77

Thus, the postage paid matches the total for services.

A few comments on the additional services should help to explain why the sender purchased them for communications with an insurance company. According to the U.S. Postal Service, "Certified Mail provides the sender with a mailing receipt and, upon request, electronic verification that an article was delivered or



sender could inquire at the sending post office. Then, "a return receipt …provides a mailer with evidence of delivery (to whom the mail was delivered and date of delivery), and information about the recipient's actual delivery address." Here, these services documented the sender's communication with the company.
