Program: The Race to the Moon and Stamp Collecting

Kurt took us through the history of the race between the USA and the USSR to the moon. Beginning with Germany's work on rocketry in World War II, Kurt talked about the steps taken by the U.S. and the USSR in the race to be the first to achieve several goals in space. He recounted the history of the USSR's first satellite and first man in space that had the U.S. scrambling to catch up and surpass their competitor. In proceeding through the program, Kurt shared anecdotes of people he new with connections to the various parts of this history that culminated with the 1969 walk on the moon. Several people shared their recollections of what they were dong and where they were when Neil Armstrong took that first step.
