After a round of introductions, we talked about Stamp Collecting Day that will be held at the church and is coming up on October 23. LaVonne reminded us that we need to pick a theme and design for the LINPEX 2023 cover cachet since time is getting short for club and Post Office approval. It is also time to be thinking about officers for 2023. Nominations will be taken in November and voting will be at the December meeting. We talked about the Omaha Stamp Show this coming weekend and future shows in Omaha. Kurt Meyer won the door prize which was the 2017-2018 24th edition of the *Post Office Guide* showing all U.S. postage stamps to date with the specifics of each stamp.

Amber Wesely passed around a tote with pictures of servicemen looking like stamps under a heading that read "First Class Forever/ In Our Hearts Forever".

Dave Wallman passed around the USPS booklet for the Great American Stamp Show held in August; an advertising piece for the International Stamp Show to be held in Boston in 2026; and a variety of items he receives with donated material, including a 10 peso banknote from Chihuahua with advertising on the back for a curio shop in Juarez, a block of six 4p Machins with a recipe for stuffed cucumbers in the selvage and a number of items that should not have gone through the mail.

Sam Zeleski passed around recently acquired Ukrainian stamps celebrating the sinking of a Russian ship and a collection of stamps and postal items for the Pete Seeger stamp.

Mark Sellhorn passed around a set of 1908 political postcards for the upcoming Presidential election—two cards promoting William H. Taft and one card promoting William J. Bryan.

The meeting was followed by the sale of donated material which was a success with over \$450 sold.

Documentation of Postage and Business Reply Service Paid

Firms that use business reply mail (BRM) offer recipients no-cost replies. During the period in which the three covers illustrated here were mailed, the U.S. Post Office Department charged 1 ¢ for each piece of BRM. In addition, the business paid the current postage for each piece.

The 4 ¢ postage due affixed to the envelope reflects the first-class surface rate of 3 ¢ for letters up to one ounce in place from July 6, 1932, through

July 31, 1958,1 and the 1 ¢ per piece BRM service charged from October 1, 1928, through June 30, 1957.2

The first card, franked with two 1 ¢ postage due stamps, shows payment for the BRM service and the prevailing rate for postal cards charged from October 1, 1928, through June 30, 1957.3

Finally, the third card shows payment for either the BRM service or the postal card rate. The post office bundled all BRM mail for a business and collected payment for the postage and service. Here, the postal clerk in Baldwinville affixed the 1 ¢ postage due stamp to reflect one of the two charges. Presumably, the top card reflected payment of the 1 ¢ balance due.




July 5, 1951 Please bring up a tank of gas in the next month and a few of these cards. Hans Winikainen


Sept 8, 1951 Sir—Please bring a new gas tank. Archie Beauregard.

The 1¢ and 2¢ postage due stamps were part of the Type of 1930–31 Issue in use through 1959.
