**Tom Johnson** showed a color printing error on a 1916-1950 postal stationery issue of a 3 cent die with the 2 cent color.

**Henry Sweets** showed an FDC of the 10c Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain) stamp (Sc. 863) autographed by Postmaster James Farley, along with the Hannibal, MO postmaster, Missouri governor, and a Missouri representative.

**Bob Akaki** showed a 1943 postcard of Ronald Reagan sent to an internee at an internment camp in Hunt, Idaho and a movie ticket to the community theatre also in Hunt, Idaho.

**Brad Shay** showed a 1940 postcard franked with a 1/2 cent prexie (sc.803) and another 1/2 cent prexie probably used as postage due.

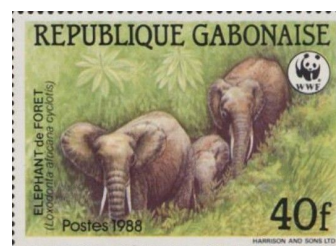
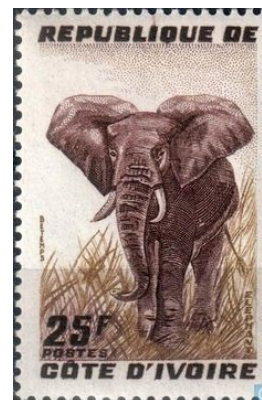

# Forwarded Post Card: Milano to Hollywood to Hailey

This post card depicts Milan's L'Arco della Pace, the Peace Arch, which stands in the Piazza Sempione. Napoleon I, who had invaded northern Italy in 1800, had ordered the erection of this monument along his route of conquest.

The stamp, Michel 77, depicts King Victor Emmanuel III. The 1901-released 10 centisimi issue was part of Italy's 1901–1922 definitive series. A table in U.S. International Postal Rates, 1872–1996, by Anthony W.

Wawrukiewicz and Henry W. Beecher, states that the single post-card rate from January 1889 to 31 January 1921 was 10 centisimi (p.277). The stamp



**Milano to Hollywood to Hailey:** The sender wrote, “Dearest Lillian, We crossed the border into Italy this morning. It is exactly as I pictured it, being perfectly beautiful. If I can get any postals [synonym for post cards] of the country and lake, I’ll send you some. Lovingly, Daisy

was cancelled twice in Italy. The circular date stamps include the location of the post office—“Milano Ferrovia” or Milan Railway—and the date “5 5 07” or 5 May 1907. The post card arrived at its original destination—Hollywood, California—10 AM 19 May 1907, as noted by the inverted cancellation to



the left of the address. A second Hollywood postmark—9 AM 21 May 1907—noted the post card's departure for Box 153, Hailey, Idaho, c/o H.M. Daft. A machine cancel covers part of the arch in the image. One can make out “Los Angeles / 2 PM / 1907.” Thus, the card passed through L.A. at some point on its journey
