Cynthia Carlson showed a cover with the name of addressee spelled out in the cancelations.


John Toy showed a LINPEX program from 1967.

WHAT DO YOU COLLECT?



What ever it is that you collect, how to display it is a question. ? One way is to do an Exhibit. With our Lincoln Stamp Club's LINPEX coming up February 27-28, this is a perfect time to display any of your items in a 1 frame (16 page) or multiple frame exhibit.

A few tips for exhibiting;

Each page should be 8 1/2 x 11, use card stock to make it stiffer. Use page protectors to hold the exhibit pages and be sure you put your name on the back of each page.

Pick a subject that isn't too broad. An example, pick Olympic Ice Skating instead of Olympics. Penguins instead of Birds. Or narrow the topic by selecting dates, like the U.S. airmail 1950-1960.

Always pick items to use that are in the best condition possible. Lay out the items on pages to see how you want to arrange them. You should have at least 2 items on a page (a large table that can be undisturbed for days works well!).

A good exhibit has a title at the beginning, a middle and an ending to tell a story. You will add write ups to the pages. SHORT is the key to explaining items. Highlight special, rare or unusual items. You can print out the write-ups and practice placing them along with the postal items to get the best look on the pages. You will notice how your eyes follow from page to page and how a balanced page looks better. Varying the page layouts so they are not all the same pattern is helpful. Large envelopes can be placed diagonally to fit. Or you could use larger 17 x 11 pages and protectors which would equal 2 pages. Have at least 3/4" margins on each page. Basically the amount of the text should be minor as compared to the philatelic material shown. The text should be large enough to read when standing in front of the exhibit.

The title page is best to make last, after you see how the sequence and the exact content of the pages tell their story. Choose an eye catching philatelic item for the title page. Have a statement on the title page that explains the purpose of the exhibit. Example; The Abundance of Olympic Ice Skaters from 1950-1980 Shown On Stamps.

Please remember that the LSC Linpex exhibits are a fun, **non-judged** event.

By exhibiting we all benefit by sharing items we collect. This is a way to educate others, help expand knowledge of a topic and learn more about the Philatelic Hobby we all enjoy.

Our club is doing a joint effort Exhibit on The 80th Anniversary of WWII. Anything that has to do with WWII is a possibility. Everyone can do 1 page (more if needed) and we will put together a collage of varied topics of WWII. This will be a fun way to work together and share interesting items. Please have done by mid February 2026.
